



NOTES
1. The strata comprising some of these sections have been named locally and consequently a similarity of name does not necessarily indicate a similarity in the character of the strata and vice versa.
2. Sections Nos. 2, 4, 11, 16 and 27 were measured by the Geological Survey and to them Note 1 does not apply.
3. Sections Nos. 1, 7, 8, 9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 17, 23, 25 and 26 were constructed from the records of the Philadelphia and Reading Coal and Iron Company and sections Nos. 3, 6, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22 and 24 from the records of Mr. J. H. Shuster, Engineer of Mines.
4. The thickness assigned to the individual strata are the true thickness perpendicular to the bedding. The thickness of the coal beds are shown as cut in the bore holes, shafts or tunnels which the system represents and do not necessarily show the average thickness of the beds where worked at other points.
5. The thickness of the strata cut in the bore holes, shafts and tunnels from which the thicknesses shown in these sections have been determined can be found in the Annual Report of the Geological Survey for 1896, Part III.
