Dear Sir:-

In accordance with departmental letter of May 27th, addressed to all coal corporations of the State of Pennsylvania, I am enclosing a map of the mineral holdings of this company, showing geographical location and mine workings as of June 30th, 1920. This is on the scale of 100 ft. to the inch and shows the crop line of the Lower Kittanning seam of coal.

The acreage shown on the map is composed of three separate leases: the first known as the Henry Lease containing approximately 51 acres of coal between oblique parallel lines indicated on the map, the second the Allison Lease containing approximately 65 acres and the third the Rupert Lease containing 20 acres more or less.

These leases were obtained by this company on July 1st, 1917 and as indicated on the map the entire front of the hill has been mined out by former operators as a "Country Bank" proposition. The mine workings shown on the map are those of this company only. The untaxed coal ahead of the present workings is estimated at 50 acres containing approximately 350,000 tons. The height of the coal at the face of the workings varies from 40 to 85 inches.
