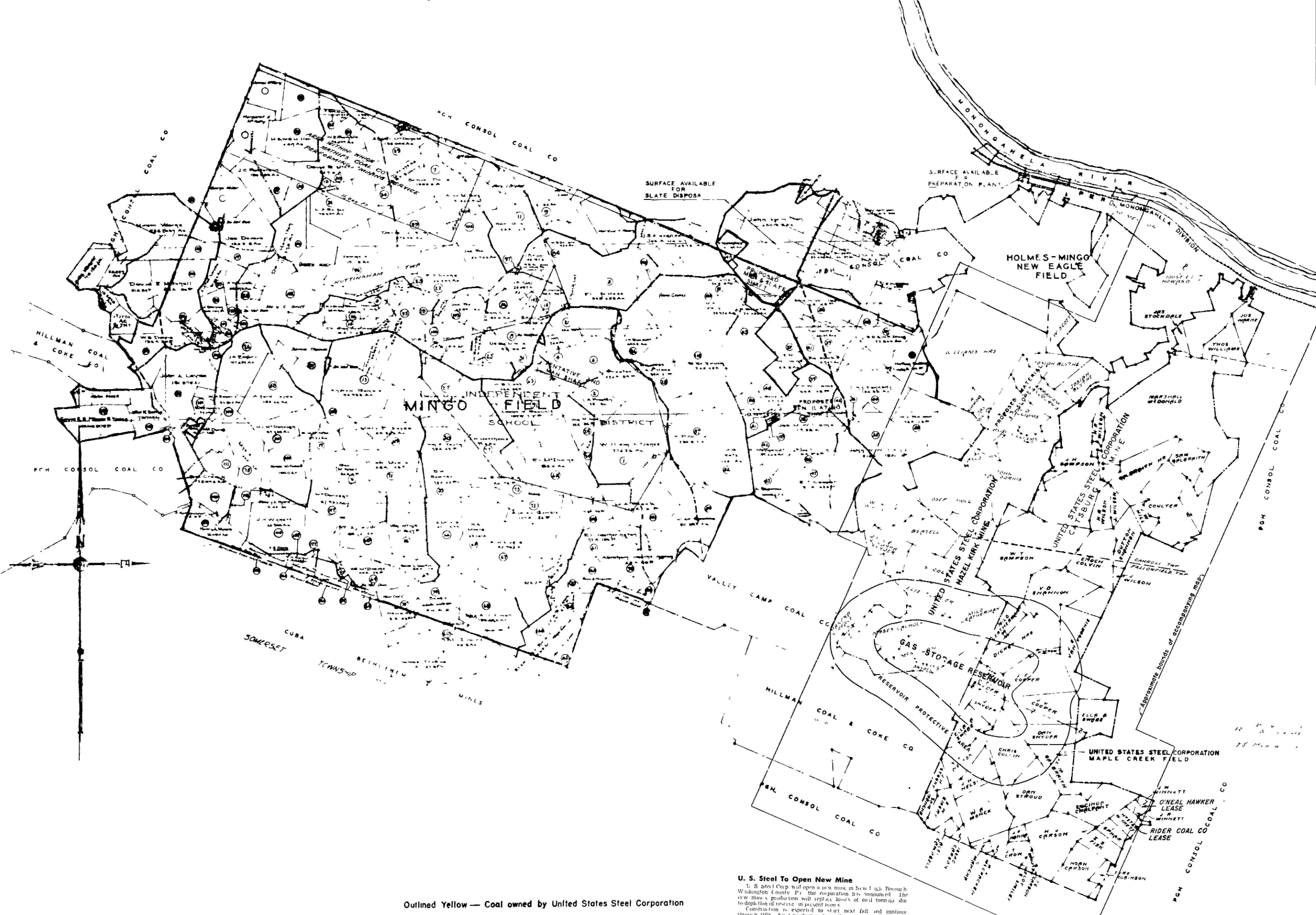




Outlined Yellow — Coal owned by United States Steel Corporation

U. S. Steel To Open New Mine

U. S. Steel Corp. will open a new mine in New York Township, Washington County, Pa. The corporation has announced. The new mine's production will replace losses of coal tonnage due to depletion of reserve in present mines.

Construction is expected to start next fall and continue through 1956. First production from the new unit is anticipated in 1959. Annual production at the mine is expected to be up to approximately 300,000 tons of run-of-mine coal. The operation will be known as the Maple Creek Mine and the coal will be used at the corporation's coke plant at Clinton Works, eight miles down the Monongahela River from river facilities of the new mine.

Corporation officials said the new mine is the first step in development of a reserve area of about 15,000 acres of Pittsburgh seam coal.
