



H.C. Sacoek's Plan of lot extending from Case to Fourth Street was surveyed in Aug 1889, and is entered in Plat Book No 1 page 61. - His second Plan extending from Fourth to Eight Street was surveyed in Dec 1895, and entered in Plat No 1 page 153. *revised*
 A.E. Sacoek's Plan of lots, west of Sacoek Street surveyed Aug 1898, and entered in Plat Book No 1 page 169.

On Division No 1 is located the "Fire Brick works" of Miller Brothers. - Division No 2 containing twenty acres. The Fire clay under, is the property of Miller Brothers. The lots on the East of Sacoek Street (excepting the School House lot) belong (if not sold) to Mrs Henry C. Sacoek. - The lots west of Sacoek Street belong to the heirs of A. E. Sacoek decd. - The entry to the Fire clay surveyed Aug 19th 1901.

The yellow lines containing twenty acres was surveyed April 21st & 22nd 1887, by order of the Parties interested.
